Mary Immaculate and John the Baptist: A Call to Conversion

In this holy season of Advent, the Church gives us two powerful themes that come together beautifully: the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception and the call of St John the Baptist. Both lead us to the same place—a humble, converted heart ready to welcome the Lord.

The Immaculate Conception is a truth long explored by theologians and scholars. They worked faithfully to understand how Mary could be conceived without original sin. God used their efforts, yet He also wanted us to know clearly that this mystery is not merely the product of human reflection, but a gift of divine revelation. That is why, in His own unexpected moment, He confirmed it through a simple, humble girl.

At Lourdes, the Blessed Virgin appeared to St Bernadette Soubirous—poor, unknown, and uneducated—and revealed herself in the local dialect:

"Que soy era Immaculada Councepciou" — "I am the Immaculate Conception."

Bernadette did not understand the phrase, yet she repeated it faithfully to her parish priest. God chose the little one to make known a great truth, reminding us that grace—not human brilliance—is the source of holiness, and that God speaks clearly to the humble and the open-hearted.

This message fits perfectly with the voice of St John the Baptist, who cries out in the Advent wilderness, "Prepare the way of the Lord!" His call to conversion is the practical response to the mystery we celebrate. His images of filling valleys, lowering mountains, straightening crooked paths, and smoothing rough roads show the inner work needed for Christ's coming: allowing God to fill our emptiness, humble our pride, correct our sinful habits, and heal the roughness of our hearts—especially through the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Mary's Immaculate Heart is the model of what God desires for us: a heart pure, humble, and fully open to His will. Bernadette Soubirous shows us the humility required to receive God's revelation. John the Baptist shows us the conversion needed to welcome Christ. Together they remind us that every achievement, talent, and skill we possess is God's gift, entrusted to us so that we may serve others honestly and return all glory to Him. As we journey through Advent, these two wondrous themes—Mary's Immaculate grace and John's call to repentance—stand together as one united invitation: Be humble, be converted, and open your heart to the coming of Christ.

Mary, conceived without original sin, pray for us sinners.
